Objectives and actions

- 1 Create the right conditions for economic growth

We will.....

- promote and market Forest Heath as a great place to live and do business
- work to make more sites available and improve existing access to allow businesses to expand and new businesses to relocate to Forest Heath
- promote and support the development of faster broadband access across the district
- provide advice and support to our businesses, including an online directory of local businesses and a programme of grants and loans to start-ups
- make significant progress towards creating an Enterprise Hub or Innovation Park in the district
- maximise the potential of the Council's business properties in supporting economic growth
- make it simpler to do business with the Council by streamlining the tendering process
- work with partners to implement the recommendations of the Council's review of educational attainment in order to improve the skills of the future workforce
- develop a clear strategy to inform and shape the Council approach to supporting families and communities in the district,
- improve the district's tourist offer, including by delivering the Home of Horseracing project in Newmarket and improvements to Mildenhall Museum
- increase opportunities for tourism in the district through grants, information and planning guidance
- deliver a programme of themed events in our main towns to improve the vibrancy of our high streets
- improve the look of our high streets through supporting shop front repainting and developing potential new designs for the Mildenhall shopping precinct
- work in partnership on a wider pedestrianisation scheme in Wellington St, Newmarket

HOUSING: meeting the district's housing need

Objectives and actions

- 1 Provide adequate provision in our planning policy framework to meet current and future housing needs
- 2 Help manage the district's existing housing stock
- 3 Use our influence to bring empty homes back into use

We will.....

- use our policies and plans to support the numbers of new homes needed in the district and ensure there is enough land to build them
- work with private developers and registered providers of social housing to build homes in Forest Heath
- ensure our policies for new housing development includes securing the right mix of market and affordable housing and is supported by infrastructure and other facilities
- support Parish and Town Councils in developing Neighbourhood Plans
- publish a tenancy policy that makes sure we make the best use of the existing housing stock by allocating homes to the most appropriate people
- champion the needs of elderly and vulnerable residents by holding other agencies to account for the quality of accommodation and services provided
- refocus the use of grants for improving housing conditions to ensure they are used to support those most in need
- provide targeted advice and support to owners of empty properties to support them in bringing them back into use, including through loans and grants
- take enforcement action where appropriate to persuade owners of empty properties to bring them back into use

- 3 To work with the community and partners to help meet the needs of residents in our market towns

We will.....

- establish locality forums across the district, supported by locality officers, to enhance residents' engagement with the Council and other public sector partners
- improve the way the Council engages with the youth community by encouraging Youth Councillors and the re-establishment of the Youth Forum
- put in place new arrangements across the district for residents to access services and for the Council to communicate with residents
- enable communities to use the opportunity to keep important assets in community ownership
- increase opportunities for volunteering by Councillors, Council staff and residents
- give each Councillor a budget to spend on the priorities in their ward
- give help to voluntary groups to raise funds and enable them to have an opportunity to run council services
- ensure the "old school" project in Brandon is completed and work with local agencies to help reduce inequalities in the town.
