BURY ROAD CAR PARK, BRANDON - LAND SWAP

- 1. Summary and reasons for recommendation(s)
- 1.1 Original proposals for a Healthy Living Centre in Brandon were agreed in 2008. This project did not proceed and a revised project has been undertaken by Suffolk County Council and various partners.
- 1.2 The former Director of Resources negotiated with Suffolk County Council in respect of this project as Suffolk County Council require an access shown on the attached plan which is currently owned by Forest Heath District Council.
- 1.3 The new proposal is that in return for this small piece of access land, Suffolk County Council will provide an additional piece of land for the car park and will resurface and realign the car park, providing increased car parking.
- 2. Recommendation(s)
- 2.1 To proceed with the land swap as detailed on the plan at Appendix A.

3. How will the recommendations help us meet our strategic priorities?

3.1 This project fulfils on of the key Community Development objectives of the FHDC Strategic Plan 2012-16 in ensuring that Objective 3 - the 'old school' project in Brandon is completed as work with local agencies to help reduce inequalities in the town.

4. Key issues

- 4.1 As part of the wider project, a customer access point will be provided within the new building together with a provision of new toilet facilities. This will reduce the ongoing revenue cost of the toilet facilities. We will also be provided with a realigned resurfaced car park.
- 4.2 The new facility will contain the children's centre, library, a police access point and a customer access point for Forest Heath District Council, providing services to the people of Brandon under one roof.

5. Other options considered

5.1 FHDC could have declined to transfer the land and granted a long lease instead in exchange for a rent although but this would not have led to much needed improvement to the public toilets nor the increased parking provision and resurfacing of the car park.
