#### Summary and reasons for recommendations:

The Council's treasury management activities generate a substantial amount of income and therefore warrant regular member consideration. The purpose of this report is to:-

- provide a summary of investment activity for the first six months of the (a) 2009/2010 financial year;
- (b) advise Members of on-going measures being taken by the Chief Finance Officer to mitigate the risks associated with the current banking crises, whilst at the same time seeking to maximise financial returns on Council investments; and
- (c) seek approval for proposed changes in the Council's lending criteria.

Despite the credit crunch and international banking crises, the Council's treasury management activities have continued to exceed budgeted rates of return on investments. Furthermore, the Council has not, to date, suffered any loss arising from the failure of a financial institution.

At the end of September 2009 interest earned amounted to £0.611m against the budget for the period of £0.421m, a surplus of £0.190m. The over achievement of interest on investments during this period was due to the achievement of higher than budgeted rates of return on investments and to rescheduling of the capital programme. The target investment rate for the year is 2.20%. In the six month period covered by this report, the average rate of interest achieved was 2.54%.

The budget for investment income for the 2009/2010 financial year is £0.751m, equivalent to £19.87 for each Council Tax Band D property.

#### <u>Summary and reasons for recommendations:</u>

The Local Authority Business Growth Incentive Scheme (LABGI) is a Government scheme whereby local authorities are rewarded in accordance with the economic growth in their area. From the financial year 2006/2007 to 2008/2009 the Council received £1,278,812 reflecting the strong economic performance of the Borough. Three previous reports (Papers Z304 Cabinet 23 Oct 2008; Y17 Cabinet 23 May 2007; and Y563 Cabinet 18 February 2008) identified how this funding could be used to promote the continued economic prosperity of St Edmundsbury.

Following a consultation exercise in September 2008 the LABGI scheme has been amended and the total amount of LABGI available has been halved. Consequently most local authorities have seen a reduction in the level of LABGI awarded and St Edmundsbury's allocation is £40,928 for this year (2009/2010). The balance brought forward from 2008/2009 is £596,228 with a projected spend to 31 March 2010 of £477,556 and therefore at the end of 2009/2010 the balance remaining (after central administration costs of £24,650 has been deducted) is projected to be £134,950.

In addition, a Section 106 (of the Town & Country Planning Act 1990) contribution of £750,000 (in addition to other elements) has been received from the Asda development. The S106 requires the £750,000 to be used for economic development within the Borough. £450,000 has been previously allocated towards the development of a Basepoint Centre on the Borough Council's land at Suffolk Business Park.

This paper reports on the progress of spending in these areas (set out in Appendix 1) and proposes a programme of future investment utilising the remainder of the LABGI funding and the available S106 contribution (set out in Tables 1, 2 and 3).

#### Recommendations:

- (1) the amended investment proposals for the available S106 funds and the Local Authority Business Growth Incentive Scheme (LABGI) for 2009/2010 and 2010/2011, as detailed in Tables 1, 2 and 3 and at Section 4 of this report be approved; and
- the Corporate Director for Economy and Environment, in consultation with the Portfolio Holder responsible for economic development and the Chief Finance Officer, be authorised, if necessary, to update and amend the investment programme in (1) above in accordance with the Council's Economic Development Strategy.

#### Summary and reasons for recommendations:

This paper allows the Cabinet to consider a joint proposal from South Lee School and the Victory Sports Ground Ltd to enhance the Victory Sports Ground in Bury St Edmunds through the provision of a sports hall and pavilion. The sports ground is owned by the Borough Council and has been successfully leased to, and managed on its behalf by, Victory Sports Ground Ltd since 2001. However, the pavilion is not fit for purpose and now requires extensive investment. There is the opportunity to attract significant external investment

(circa £1.8m) to improve community sports facilities in the area, by way of a £25,000 capital contribution from the Borough Council to Victory Sports Ground Ltd, linked to negotiations regarding the future level of revenue support.

#### **Recommendations:**

- (1) The Council works in a partnering arrangement with South Lee School and Victory Sports Ground Ltd to develop a scheme to build a new sports hall and pavilion on the Victory Sports Ground, Bury St Edmunds;
- (2) the Council allocates £25,000 in its capital programme to pay to the Victory Sports Ground Ltd as its contribution to the costs of removing the existing pavilion;
- (3) payment of the Council's contribution be conditional upon:-
  - (a) an agreement being reached with Victory Sports Ground Ltd that, following the construction of any new facilities, its revenue grant from the Council be reduced by way of a mechanism linked to increases in income;
  - (b) South Lee School and Victory Sports Ground Ltd obtaining sufficient funding to proceed with the scheme;
  - (c) the satisfactory completion of the necessary legal agreements;
  - (d) planning consent being obtained; and
  - (e) the completion of a community use agreement with South Lee School; and
- (4) the Corporate Director for Community Services, in consultation with the Portfolio Holder for Culture and Sport, be authorised to agree the details of the scheme with South Lee School and Victory Sports Ground Ltd and to release the Council's capital contribution.

#### Summary and reasons for recommendation:

It is recommended that an allocation of £400,000 be made from the Council's Affordable Housing capital budget to enable the delivery of 17 affordable homes at the former Fireworks Factory Site, Bury Road, Chedburgh.

The funding of £400,000 will 'unlock' this site and deliver affordable housing over the next 2 years, assisting the Borough Council to meet its affordable housing target.

Some of this funding will, over a period of time, be reimbursed and will assist delivering other benefits to the community.

#### Recommendation:

It is recommended that an allocation of £400,000 be made from the Council's Affordable Housing capital budget to enable the delivery of 17 affordable homes at the former Fireworks Factory Site, Bury Road, Chedburgh.
