8. Local Standards Assessment: Changes to Constitution

Part 10 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 contains changes to the current system of reporting and investigating complaints against Councillors for alleged breach of the Code of Conduct.

The main effect of the provisions, which are expected to come into effect on 1 April 2008, is to give Standards Committees the task of receiving and assessing complaints to decide whether and if so how they should be further investigated. At present, this function is carried out by the national body, the Standards Board for England. Periodic returns will be made to the Board detailing the number of complaints and how they were dealt with.

In the knowledge that the changes were coming, Article 9 of the Constitution was amended to provide that one of the Standards Committee's functions would be "dealing with the filtering of complaints" and also to require the Committee to be chaired by an Independent Member.

It is now appropriate to refine the provisions of the constitution with regard to the role of the Standards Committee and the duties of the Monitoring Officer.

The Panel is therefore asked to **RECOMMEND** to Council that the following amendments be made to the constitution:-

(1) Article 9, paragraph 9.3.1 (h) be amended to read:

"To carry out all the powers and duties contained in Part 10 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 and regulations made thereunder including but not limited to local assessment of complaints and the making of returns to the Standards Board"; and

(2) Responsibility for Council FunctionsSection C. Standards Committee be deleted.

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(3) Scheme of Delegation of Officers: Head of Legal and Democratic Services paragraph F3 (a) (1) 1. of the scheme of delegation, after "Local Government Act 2000" there be inserted "and Part 10 of the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007".
