	The schedule of recommendations from the meeting held on 23 June 2014 were received and noted.	NOTED
027	MARKETS UPDATE (VERBAL)	
	The Steering Group received and noted a presentation from the Market Development Officer which explained that this role was responsible for the promotion and development of the markets within West Suffolk. The Officer also outlined the following initiatives:	NOTED
	<ul> <li>'Love your Local Market' Campaign had been held in May 2014.</li> <li>Youth markets had been held in Haverhill and Bury St Edmunds and had been very popular. It was hoped that further events could be developed with West Suffolk College.</li> <li>A food festival had been held at The Guineas, Newmarket from 28 to 30 August 2014.</li> <li>Work was being undertaken with the local RAF bases to encourage use of the local markets. A very successful event had also been held on 4 July 2014 in Bury St Edmunds and Mildenhall.</li> <li>Christmas markets for 2014.</li> <li>A national initiative with Trading Standards ('Real Deal'), which was designed to reduce counterfeit sales at British markets.</li> </ul>	
	The Officer was also developing a strategic market plan for each town. Once completed, this plan would be presented to the Steering Group, in early 2015, for consideration. Members welcomed this approach and suggested that the plan may also need to consider the following information:	
	<ul> <li>The overall economic value of the markets to the towns.</li> <li>The value of the reputation of the markets.</li> <li>Targets and aspirations to fill the market pitches.</li> <li>The market traders to be provided with the same support as the shops, to enable them to compete on an equal footing.</li> </ul>	
	Members then discussed further issues in relation to the markets and also proposed other initiatives which may assist with the general promotion of the markets.

It was considered that it would be useful to receive this information, in advance of the consideration of the strategic plan.

	The Steering Group received and noted a presentation (attached) from the Planning Policy and Specialist Services Manager in relation to planning policy growth for West Suffolk, which covered the following areas:	NOTED
	<ul> <li>Planning Policy Framework</li> <li>Growth Forecast</li> <li>Planned Growth for Forest Heath and St Edmundsbury</li> </ul>	
	The Officer also explained that it would be the intention for regular reporting on major projects to be provided to the Steering Group.	
	A discussion was held on a range of issues arising from the presentation, which included:	
	(a) Members wished to be informed of the number of house building completions still required to meet the 2031 targets. The Head of Planning and Regulatory Services confirmed that this information would be provided to the next meeting of the Steering Group.	
	(b) Members suggested that a summit meeting be organised with MPs and MEPs to assist with the lobbying on the infrastructure requirements within West Suffolk, particularly with regard to roads and rail links (including projections with regard to traffic and rail passenger growth).	
	(c) To encourage developers to build 'homes for life'. The Planning Services Manager explained that the requirements for the provision of homes and the aspiration and standard of those homes, could be determined through the use of development briefs. It may also be a role for the Design Review Panel
