8. Brecks Partnership and Dedham Vale Area of Natural Beauty (AONB) and Stour Valley Project

The Brecks Partnership and the Dedham Vale and Stour Valley Project are separate partnerships established to protect and promote the environments and economies of these two nationally important areas of natural beauty. They assist the Borough Council in its planning, environmental, economic and heritage functions, and the Council is represented on both bodies.

The current memoranda of agreement for the two partnerships expire in March 2012 (Brecks) and March 2013 (Dedham Vale and Stour Valley).

It was agreed in 2010/2011 that the Borough Council would maintain support for both partnerships given the good value for money they represented in terms of fulfilling the Council's aspirations and duties for the two areas.

However, both partnerships have recognised that, to keep in line with their local authority funders, they will need to continue to reduce their costs if they are to survive. The partnerships have therefore agreed to reduce their overheads to allow the Borough Council and the other local authority partners to reduce their contributions.

The first of these reductions were agreed for 2011/2012. For next year, 2012/2013, the majority of the funding partners have again indicated that they will be making cuts in their contributions of between 5% and 20%, and the partnerships are therefore budgeting on that basis. It is proposed that the Borough Council reduces its contributions by a further 10% from 2012/2013, as follows:-

2011/2012 2012/2013 Brecks £11,654 £10,489 Dedham Vale/Stour £13,330 £11,997

Since the two organisations are principally local authority partnerships, any savings agreed will contribute to the Council's general Dynamic Review – Innovation, Value and Enterprise (DR-IVE) efficiency programme rather than being re-distributed to voluntary or community organisations.

It is **RECOMMENDED** that the Borough Council reduces it contributions to the Brecks Partnership and the Dedham Vale AONB and Stour Valley Project by 10% from 2012/2013 to £10,489 and £11,997 respectively.
