10. Village of the Year Competition 2010

The 2010 Village of the Year Competition, which is being sponsored by BT in association with IP-City Network, is open to villages with 501 to 3000 local government electors. In St Edmundsbury 20 villages are eligible.

Judges will be looking at:-

- (i) community spirit;
- (ii) care taken of the village;
- (iii) its attitude to caring for the natural environment;
- (iv) the parish council; and
- (v) special activities.

Judges will be looking closely at plans for the future of the village as well as its recent achievements. They want to see that all residents are listened to and catered for, from the youngest to the oldest. Splendid new halls and transport initiatives will be applauded but so will simple low cost ideas such as a rota for collecting prescriptions, or the care of those who are housebound or people with cars offering rides to town for those with no transport. A variety of clubs for all ages and a high proportion of residents joining in is just as impressive.

Officers have sent application packs to all the Parish Councils for the eligible villages, and have also sent details to the relevant ward members, asking them to help with promotion.

The deadline for applications is 14 May 2010. To date no applications have been received, so officers would like to again ask relevant Members to promote the opportunity to enter the competition.
