6. Update on the Start of a Project to Investigate Opportunities to Improve Efficiency in the Collection of Bulk Refuse

An Operations Project Team was established to review potential areas of further joint working to demonstrate and deliver quick wins, resolve specific operational problems/constraints and improve service efficiency.

Following a joint operations meeting on 11 September 2009, it was agreed to undertake a three month trial from 1 October to 31 December 2009 of the following operational changes to collection of bulk refuse:-

- (a) reduce the current four vehicles and six personnel to two vehicles and four personnel. (spare vehicles to be retained for the duration of the trial);
- (b) cease the bulk service during the Christmas period in both authorities to release staff for other duties;

In addition to this, further opportunities to be considered include:

- (c) a review of the potential to develop a joint policy on the collection of bulk refuse, incorporating collection standards and a revised pricing strategy; and
- (d) a review of joint branding on wheeled bins and commercial vehicles.

Throughout the trial, there will be monitoring of operational outcomes and customer satisfaction.

It is recommended that:-

- (1) the project outcomes be noted; and
- (2) a progress report be submitted to the next Joint Committee meeting.

7. Suffolk Waste Partnership (SWP) Consultation Responses submitted on:

1. stage one consultation on the transposition of the revised Waste Framework Directive; and

2. consultation on the Strategy for Hazardous Waste Management in England.

Synopsis 1

The purpose of the Waste Framework Directive (WFD) is to lay down measures on EU Member States ...'to protect the environment and human health by preventing or reducing adverse impacts of the generation and management of waste and by reducing overall impacts of resource use and improving the efficiency of such use.'

This stage one consultation seeks views on the transposition and implementation of the following provisions within the WFD:-

- (a) the waste hierarchy;
- (b) extended producer responsibility;
- (c) re-use recycling and collection:-
 - (i) re-use and preparing for re-use activities;
 - (ii) separate collections of waste;
 - (iii) household waste recycling target; and
 - (iv) construction and demolition waste;
- (d) principles of self sufficiency and proximity;
- (e) hazardous waste:-
 - (i) waste oils;
 - (ii) bio-waste;
 - (iii) waste management plans; and
 - (iv) waste prevention programmes

A response was submitted by Suffolk County Council on behalf of the SWP and this was endorsed through a separate joint submission by FHDC and SEBC. A copy of our response is attached as Report **A263**.

Synopsis 2

The purpose of the Strategy for Hazardous Waste Management is to provide clarity on how the requirements of the revised WFD should be implemented with respect to the management of hazardous waste. The strategy is also intended to facilitate the provision of infrastructure for the management of hazardous waste.

The strategy is made up of seven high level principles for the management of hazardous waste. Consultees are invited to comment on whether they support each of the seven principles which are categorised under the headings below:-

- (i) the waste hierarchy;
- (ii) infrastructure provision;
- (iii) reduce our reliance on landfill;
- (vi) no mixing or dilution;
- (v) treatment of organic hazardous wastes;
- (vi) end reliance on the use of Landfill Directive waste acceptance criteria derogations; and
- (vii) treatment and landfilling of hazardous waste.

A response was submitted by Suffolk County Council on behalf of the SWP and this was endorsed through a separate joint submission by FHDC and SEBC. A copy of our response is attached as Report **A264**.
