Amendments to the Constitution: Licensing

1. Background

1.1 The Democratic Renewal Panel has as part of it Terms of Reference, to 'recommend amendments to the Council's Constitution to full Council'.

2. Proposed Amendments: Licensing Functions

- 2.1 It is expected that provision will need to be made for a number of changes to the licensing function in respect of changes to the Licensing Act 2003, which will be effected by the Police Reform and Social Responsibility Act 2011. The Head of Environmental Health and Housing and Licensing Services Manager have reviewed the delegations in the Constitution and request the amendments to the Constitution as detailed (emboldened) in Appendix A.
- 2.2 Currently no regulations have been published with respect to the anticipated changes, which include:-
 - (a) the Licensing Authority becoming a Responsible Authority; and
 - (b) Environmental Health becoming a Responsible Authority for the purposes of considering Temporary Event Notices from a prevention of public nuisance perspective.

3. Recommendation

3.1 The Working Party is **RECOMMENDED** to approve the amendments proposed in Appendix A to Report C345.
