Grant Working Party 5 March 2013

Streamlining Rural Grants Decision Making

1. Summary and reasons for recommendations

- 1.1 St Edmundsbury Borough Council and Forest Heath District Council are in the process of forming a single West Suffolk staff structure. To maximise the savings achievable both Councils are reviewing how they manage their business to ensure it is conducted as efficiently as possible.
- 1.2 In this context, at its 11 December 2012 meeting, the Working Party received a request from the Cabinet to consider how the decision making for the rural grants, the Rural Initiatives Grants Scheme (RIGS), might be streamlined. Background information on the level of awards made from RIGS funding has been made available to Working Party Members and Substitutes and they have been asked to provide comments.
- 1.3 Reflecting on the level of awards made from 2010/2011 to date and the current operation of the e-mail system, two of the Members responding to the request for comments have suggested extending the voting system to all applications for RIGS funding. The third response suggests that the work of the Working Party should be incorporated into the remit of the Performance and Audit Scrutiny Committee.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 It is **<u>RECOMMENDED</u>** to Cabinet that the following be approved:
 - all applications for Rural Initiatives Grant Scheme funding are dealt with via the e-mail system, as detailed in Section 4 of Report D318; and
 - (2) the Grants Policy and the scheme of delegation be amended to reflect the use of the e-mail system for grants up to the maximum of £10,000.

3. Corporate priorities

- 3.1 The recommendations meet the following, as contained within the Corporate Plan:
 - (a) Corporate priorities 1 and 2: 'Working together for strong, healthy and diverse communities,, and 'Working together for prosperous and environmentally-responsible communities'; and
 - (b) Vision 2025: St Edmundsbury will be a place which: has one of the healthiest resident populations in the country (V:He1); where the wide range of accessible leisure and cultural facilities on offer provides opportunities for all sectors of the community (V:L2); and where all residents live within walking distance of recreational and countryside activities (V:L4).

4. Key issues

- 4.1 The request made of the Grant Working Party by Cabinet was 'To look at ways of further streamlining the current process of handling applications for rural grants, perhaps making more use of the electronic system, and reviewing delegations'. The Working Party noted that a report would be brought to its next meeting, when a report back to Cabinet would be made with suggestions to implement in 2013/2014, and that in the meantime Members' views would be sought on how a new streamlined system might work.
- 4.2 Under the current Grants Policy, grant applications up to £5,000 are circulated via e-mail and provided a majority of Members, including Substitutes where appropriate, agree the grant is then approved by officers under delegated authority. This allows decisions to be made within 14 days of receiving a fully completed application. Where there is not a majority the application is then considered at the next meeting of the Grant Working Party. On the only occasion when this has happened, in the case of an application from Little Thurlow for funding for a local history book, the decision not to make an award was confirmed at the meeting of the Working Party.
- 4.3 All applications for sums between £5,001 and £10,000 are currently considered by the Grant Working Party at its next meeting. If received shortly after the previous meeting there can be a delay of almost 3 months before it goes to the Working Party, and a further 1-2 months for the recommendations from the Working Party to be considered/confirmed by the Cabinet.
- 4.4 The spreadsheets, attached as Appendices A and B, were circulated to Members to provide:
 - (i) an overview of level of awards made over whole the life of the RIGS funding; and
 - (ii) from the 2010/2011 financial year to date.
- 4.5 The figures at Appendix B show that since April 2010, there have been seven applications in the £5,001 to £10,000 range requiring Working Party consideration while the great majority of applications, 31, have been dealt with via the e-mail system.

4.6 Three members of the Working Party responded to the request for comments. Two suggested that it would be appropriate to consider all RIGS applications via the e-mail system. As well as speeding up Grant Working Party consideration of the applications it also removes the need for a recommendation to go to Cabinet. The third suggestion was that the Grant Working Party be dissolved and the remit of the Performance and Audit Scrutiny Committee be extended to incorporate the work. The suggestion is that the work transfers on the basis of the current decision-making process.

Extending the e-mail voting system

- 4.7 If the scheme is extended, it is recognised that Officers must continue to ensure a sufficient level of detail is provided to enable members of the Working Party to make an informed choice from the information available in the e-mail. Members will be aware that they can still raise queries/request further information when an application is considered via the e-mail system, and that Officers will go back to applicants to get answers to queries raised and circulate the information to all involved in considering the application. This ability to follow-up queries promptly and re-circulate Working Party members with the outcome quickly is preferable to an application having to be deferred for consideration at a future meeting which is likely to be three months away.
- 4.8 It would also help manage the situation which can arise now when an applicant rushes to put their application in order to meet Working Party deadlines when the application might benefit from a little more detail.
- 4.9 If Members were unable to reach a consensus, then the option of referring the application to the next Grant Working Party could be retained if desired.

For information, officers can confirm that:

- (i) Cabinet has never overturned or amended a RIGS grant recommendation it has received from the Working Party;
- (ii) to date there have not been any occasions when the e-mail voting system has not produced a consensus; and
- (iii) a number of Officers across the Council already have delegated authority to authorise expenditure of £10,000 or more so this approach does not present any problems in terms of financial delegations.
- 4.10 If the Working Party moves to considering all applications by e-mail, Members may wish to consider incorporating into the e-mail system a mechanism for suggesting a lower award than that recommended by the Officers. Officers can work up some basic rules to facilitate this if required. It is suggested this should only apply to applications from £5,001 to £10,000 which are currently considered by the Working Party.

Transferring the function to the Performance and Audit Scrutiny Committee

4.11 This suggestion reduces the number of Working Party meetings by one and transfers the function to a Committee which is already concerned with budgeting and the efficient use of the Council's finances.

- 4.12 This suggestion does not of itself reduce the volume of business to be considered as the suggestion is to transfer the work on the basis of the current decision-making processes. The advantages to applicants of more speedy decision-making would not be achieved, although Members of the Working Party could consider a transfer and recommend an extension of the e-mail system of decision making.
- 4.13 The Performance and Audit Scrutiny Committee currently meets five times a year and Members of the Working Party will want to consider whether there is the capacity to incorporate all the work of the Grant Working Party, i.e. RIGS applications, the annual round of core funding applications and review and update of the Council's Grants Policy, in addition to what is already a full work programme, particularly in the Autumn when the Budget is being prepared.

5. Other options considered

- 5.1 The options outlined at 4.6 to 4.11 have been identified by the Councillors responding to the invitation to provide comments.
- 5.2 Other options, such as raising the limit for e-mail applications to some amount less than £10,000, could be discussed by the Working Party. However a blanket system of e-mail decision-making for all RIGS grants is the most efficient to administer and offers the greatest opportunity to streamline decision making whilst still providing a focus on the grant-giving process.
- 5.3 To make no change to the current system is also an option but would not be in the spirit of the original request from the Cabinet.

6. Community impact
