Haverhill High Street Improvement Scheme: Progress Update		On 9 May 2013 - HAWP agreed that High Street improvements to be looked at again following a stakeholder event regarding transport needs. In response to question asked at last HAWP meeting on 19 June 2014, SCC has confirmed that of the £183K allocated to the High Street in the Local Transport Plan, £9,555.15 has been spent. This spend covered some staff time contribution to the 2012 consultation and also the recent Experimental Traffic Regulation Order consultation. SCC would expect the remaining budget of £173,444.85 to remain available beyond 2014/15 to support a scheme delivered by SEBC's Growth Area Fund.
