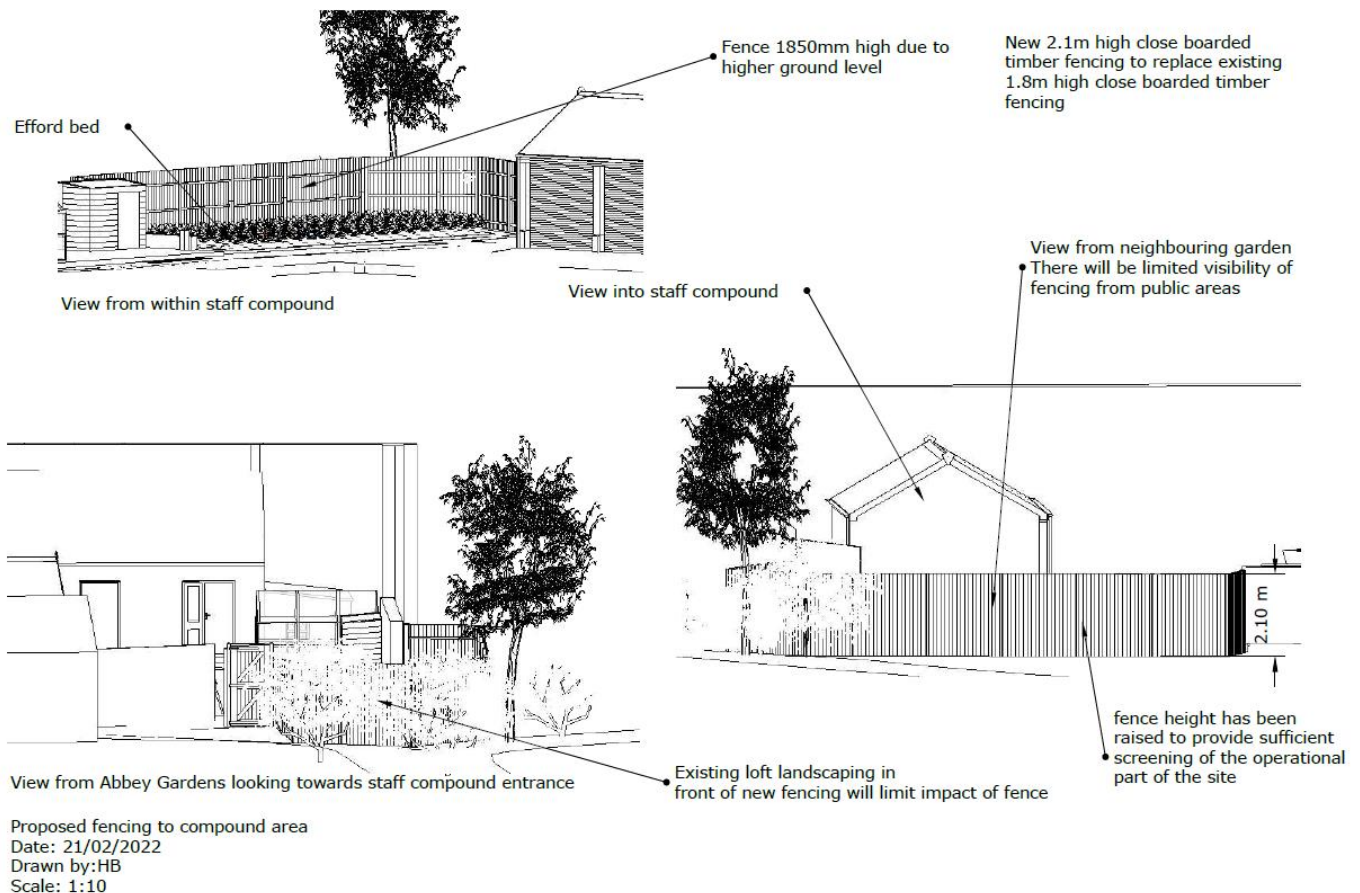

Proposed Fencing Elevations** – Following publication of the Development Control Committee Report, Officers have received further plans, illustrating the proposed fencing to the compound area at the site.
