The West Suffolk Housing Strategy recognised the importance of maximising the use of existing housing. Forest Heath and St Edmundsbury Councils offered discretionary grant assistance under the Housing Assistance Policy. The Strategy contained an action to review and revise the Policy to ensure that it continued to meet its purpose. The review had considered that, in the main, the existing Policy helped to ensure decent safe housing for households benefiting from a grant. However, some changes were considered necessary to simplify the Policy and increase uptake. Processes would also be introduced to ensure that as much funding was recovered as possible, so that the Councils could continue to offer grants and investment in this sector.	The alternatives were to reduce the extent of the Policy or to dispense with it (since there was no legal requirement for it). However, the aim of the Housing Strategy was to increase the number of decent homes occupied, particularly for more vulnerable residents, so these options were not considered further.
