At present, Data Protection in the UK is governed by the Data Protection Act 1998. On 25 May 2018, the General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) would come into effect and replace the Data Protection Act. The key new requirements under GDPR and how these were different to the current Data Protection Act requirements, were outlined in Appendix 1 to Report No: CAB/FH/17/046. This Appendix also included details of how the Council was seeking to comply with these requirements. A	GDPR was a legal requirement.
