A statement of policy typically runs for a period of three years, although there was nothing to prevent the authority from updating more frequently if it wished to. The current policy would expire on 30 January 2019, and a revised version had been consulted on with statutory consultees. This would then require review in 2021 for readoption by January 2022. The Cabinet particularly discussed the regulatory and enforcement powers of the local authority in relation to fixed odds betting terminals in betting shops and the harm that gambling could cause to some individuals. In particular reference was made to the Local Area Profile for Newmarket and it was requested to ensure that this adequately reflected the Town's particular local circumstances and that the most up-to-date and relevant data was used when applying the licensing principles. Therefore, the Cabinet agreed to amend the original recommendation (as set out in the previous column) to reflect these issues.
