1. Key issues and reasons for recommendation

1.1 Background

 - Financial services (including audit)
 - Health and safety
 - Human resources (including payroll)
 - ICT
 - Learning and development
 - Legal services
 - Performance and risk management
 - Procurement
 - Scrutiny management and support
