#### 1. Key issues and reasons for recommendation(s)

#### 1.1 **Background**

- 1.1.1 The Core Strategy Single Issue Review (CS SIR) revisits the quashed parts of the 2010 Core Strategy as well as reassessing overall housing need/numbers to ensure compliance with the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF).
- 1.1.2 An 'Issues and Options' (Regulation 18) consultation was completed on the CS SIR in July to September 2012, with a second Issues and Options (Regulation 18) consultation taking place between August and October 2015. A preferred option consultation was completed between April and July 2016 (Regulation 18).
- 1.1.3 A final submission consultation (Regulation 19) is scheduled to take place between 10 January and 21 February 2017 and it is the submission draft of the CS SIR which is attached to this report (See Working Paper 1).

## <u>Core Strategy Single Issue Review Submission document</u> (Regulation 19)

- 1.1.4 Since the 2015 issues and options and the 2016 preferred options consultations on the CS SIR, Officers have been preparing the final submission version of the document. This is last stage of consultation prior to the document, together with the supporting information and evidence and representations received, being submitted to the Planning Inspectorate for Examination in Public.
- 1.1.5 The SIR submission draft has been reviewed by the Planning Advisory Service and an external expert planning solicitor who have provided feedback and provides the Council confidence that the documents prepared are robust to minimise risk of a successful challenge. The Council's Communications Team have also read and commented upon documents.
- 1.1.6 Working Paper 1 is the final 'Submission' (Regulation 19) CS SIR consultation document. This statutory Local Plan document confirms the district's overall housing need over the period 2011 2031 and how that housing need is distributed among the settlements.
- 1.1.7 Officers will make a presentation to Members on the content of the CS SIR document at the Local Plan Working Group meeting.

## <u>Core Strategy Single Issue Review submission consultation</u> (Regulation 19)

1.1.8 The final Regulation 19 consultation on this document will be focused on the whether the CS SIR is a 'legally compliant' and 'sound' document. The consultation will ask the public and stakeholders specific questions required by the Planning Inspectorate and requires that representations consider whether the tests of soundness have been met as set out in the

introduction to the document in Working Paper 1.

## 1.2 <u>Sustainability Appraisal (SA) and Habitat Regulations Assessment</u> (HRA)

- 1.2.1 A Sustainability Appraisal (SA) is a tool for appraising policies to ensure they reflect sustainable development objectives. Sustainability Appraisals are required for all local development documents. Strategic Environmental Assessment (SEA) is a procedure (set out in the Environmental Assessment of Plans and Programmes Regulations 2004) which requires the formal environmental assessment of certain plans and programmes which are likely to have significant effects on the environment.
- 1.2.2 Consultants have been appointed to undertake the full SA and SEA work in relation to the final submission draft of the CS SIR document. A full report setting out the findings of the SA and SEA will accompany the CS SIR document for consultation in January 2017.
- 1.2.3 A Habitat Regulations Assessment (HRA) form part of a European Directive that requires 'appropriate assessment' of plans and projects that are, either alone or in combination with other plans and projects, likely to have a significant impact on certain designated habitats.
- 1.2.4 Consultants have been appointed to undertake the full HRA work in relation to the final submission draft of the CS SIR document. A full report setting out the findings of the HRA will accompany the CS SIR document for consultation in January 2017.

#### 2. Next Steps

- 2.1 Following this Local Plan Working Group meeting, the final Submission version (Regulation 19) CS SIR document will be taken for approval for consultation and submission to the Secretary of State, following consultation, to Cabinet on 13 December 2016 and Council on 21 December 2016.
- 2.2 The design and printing of the consultation documents will take a further few weeks from the Council meeting; **therefore**, **consultation is planned from 10 January until 21 February 2017**.
- 2.3 The change in consultation date for the next consultation (originally due to commence November 2016) has required an update to the Local Development Scheme (timetable for plan preparation). This has been published on the Council's website. This amendment to the timeline does not affect the anticipated adoption of the document in December 2017.
- 2.4 Comments received during this next consultation will be submitted directly to the Secretary of State with the Local Plan documents for his/her consideration through a Local Plan Examination led by an independent Planning Inspector. It is anticipated that the Submission of

- the documents for independent examination will take place in early March 2017.
- 2.5 The above timetable is subject to a health warning. Factors beyond the council's control could cause delay such as:
  - The introduction of new planning guidance;
  - Major issues raised by consultees at the final consultation stage which require further consideration/modifications to the Local Plan.
- 2.6 Should any of these issues arise, a further meeting of the Local Plan Working Group will be set to outline options for progressing the Single Issue Review and the consequential impact on the Local Plan timetable.
