Overview

SARS was set up to provide a local enhanced emergency medical resource in Suffolk. SARS exists to help treat patients who require specialist medical care before they reach hospital. SARS responders have specialist skills and can carry drugs and equipment not available on frontline ambulances. This means they can undertake advanced procedures at the scene of an incident that would not normally be possible outside a hospital environment. SARS is mobilised by a specialist critical care desk run by the ambulance service and we have helped 1000's of patients in and around Suffolk. This includes the St Edmundsbury district, which is a key area for our activity.

Community Chest funding would be used for training and equipment costs for SARS solo and team responders who are active in the St Edmundsbury district.

Typical incidents SARS responders attend include patients critically injured in road traffic collisions or suffering life-threatening illnesses such as cardiac arrests. SARS responders have specialist skills and can carry drugs and equipment not available on frontline ambulances. This means they can undertake advanced procedures at the scene of an incident which would not normally be possible outside a hospital environment. This can mean truly life-saving interventions and the attendance of a SARS specialist can also help reduce the chances of patients suffering permanent disabilities. SARS is mobilised by a specialist critical care desk run by the ambulance service and we have helped 1000's of patients in and around Suffolk. This includes the St Edmundsbury district which is a key area for our activity.

SARS was originally set up back in 1972 by local doctors precisely because they wanted to offer a high level of immediate medical care to patients who might not otherwise survive en route to hospital. That is still the case in 2018. SARS responders are mobilised to patients who need urgent and specialist medical care and we are committed to providing a local network of resources who can help these patients on a voluntary basis.

Our responders live in or are based very close to Suffolk including several residing in the St Edmundsbury area. These clinicians are members of the local community who have a desire to help other local residents. This is exemplified by the fact that despite full-time paid jobs, they will still volunteer in their spare time to respond to local people in need.

SARS responders are still being mobilised to incidents every week and there will always be a group of very sick or critically injured patients who need specialist prehospital care.

So far in 2018 we have been mobilised to calls in St Edmundsbury on average every week. The majority of these calls have proved to be serious or life-threatening incidents.

Whenever we meet former patients it is clear that the benefit is not just to the individual themselves but to their entire social network of family, friends and work colleagues. Any figure we come up with would inevitably be arbitrary as where do you stop with the benefits of this type of activity.

We know that what SARS does has an incredible impact on the patients treated by our volunteers. For example, one of our responders recently saved a patient's life by being first on scene with the appropriate equipment and skills to administer the necessary treatment. In the words of the daughter of this patient, this has enabled her parent to see her first grandchild grow up. If we did nothing else this year, knowing that we had achieved just this one outcome would have made all our activity worthwhile. We do keep records of our activity in the St Edmundsbury district and can provide data on this. We are also looking at ways at getting more "patient stories" as these are by far the most powerful illustration of the value of SARS responders' voluntary work.

We would anticipate that SARS would respond to at least 50-60 incidents each year.

We are an independent charity but we can only be mobilised by the East of England Ambulance Service via 999. The nature of our activity automatically means that we work alongside the statutory emergency services and air ambulances at the scenes of incidents

As we have mentioned we keep a record of our mobilizations and our current level of activity is the best illustration of the current need. We have already responded to

a greater number of St Edmundsbury call outs in 2018 than we did in the whole of 2017.

SARS was originally set up back in 1972 by local doctors precisely because they wanted to offer a high level of immediate medical care to patients who might not otherwise survive en route to hospital. For the last couple of years, a former SARS patient has sat on our trustee board and is playing a key role in influencing SARS future development.
