RECOMMENDED: That Council:

- (1) endorses the proposal to purchase the property at Vicon House, Western Way, Bury St Edmunds for a sum of £3,266,000 (Three Million Two Hundred and Sixty Six Thousand Pounds) excluding VAT, fees and Stamp Duty Land Tax, as set out in Exempt Report No: CAB/JT/19/006 and its Addendum, to be funded from the Investing in the Growth Agenda fund;
- (2) establishes a capital budget of £3,503,480 to be made available to facilitate the purchase, including fees and Stamp Duty Land Tax, to be funded from the Investing in our Growth Agenda Fund; and

- (3) notes that should the purchase be made, the Council's Section 151 Officer will make the necessary changes to the Council's prudential indicators as a result of Recommendation (1).
